#### 6. Partner updates and discussion

#### a. MM (Sydenham Wells Park)

- i. Owl box is up, hoping they will nest in the park
- ii. Blue Chain dredged the small pond
- iii. Sydenham Ridge Forum is being set up

## b. ET (F/O Garthorne Road NR)

- i. Workdays continue but with low numbers
- ii. Planted a native hedge
- iii. Buzzard in the area
- iv. Planning bat walk for local scouts, but no date yet

#### c. LBC (Healthy Rivers, Riverfly) - sent in writing due to connection issues

- i. Julia Grollman is leaving Riverfly end of march and Donna is stepped BG up to help run project with me.
- ii. Riverfly training is on April 8th at Manor Park, Thames21 (Jack Beard) will be running the day. This is open to all with primary goal to find new Riverfly people for Ladywell, Manor Park and Brookmill as Julia, Tom and Alex are leaving.
- iii. Two clean ups in Dec and Jan were cancelled due to weather.

- iv. we have a clean up event at Brookmill on 22/2/25 10.30-1.00, booking details to follow.
- v. Lastly, we do 5 sampling events in Lewisham a month, every month.

#### d. KS (Creekside Discovery Centre)

- i. Port of London Authority funding- series of fish surveys monthly from April onwards (6 sessions). Open to the public.
- ii. Researching invertebrate species management in Creek

#### e. ASh (F/O Mayow Park)

- i. NG volunteer sessions were fantastic, nature area restored, c100m hedge, new pond near the orchard
- ii. adding new bat/ bird boxes from KW fund, waiting on Glendale infrastructure team for installation
- iii. bat walks upcoming, no dates set yet AS will promote from friends of group

## f. ASI (Chinbrook Community Orchards & Chinbrook Meadows)

- i. successful Chinbrook Allotment Orchard Wassail
- ii. volunteer sessions in the new wetlands and in the park, including creating a dead hedge to prevent dog poaching
- iii. EA visited the park and are keen to remove a concrete bit from the river
- iv. Sparrowhawks, buzzards, little egrets, grey wagtails are settling back in the new wetlands

## g. AED (Hillcrest Woods)

- i. new pond at Hillcrest, already filling up, positive mention for Froglife and contractor
- ii. request for NG session there to help with planting and conservation day-

## ACTION: JK to speak with AED about tasks on site

- iii. some trees overgrown (3) and possibly damaging existing wall there, asking tree officers for assistance
- iv. AED would like key for regular access to monitor site
- v. ET adding that there are bat boxes on site, AED mentions access to the boxes is hard as no key to get in. hopes that pond will help local bat population

#### h. TR (Ladywell Fields User Group)

- i. successful from tree council bid- 70m conservation hedgerow in N field volunteer sessions this weekend 10-12.
- ii. new fruit tree planting in the orchard, quince and other spp. (also some silver birch have been planted in wrong places)
- iii. did a successful batwalk, via eventbrite.

#### i. GT (F/O Ladywell and Brockley Cemeteries)

- i. 1 February: Nature's Gym session
- ii. 8 March: international Womens day walk
- iii. 27 March: bat walk, trying to get permission for it and considering using Eventbrite for the event
- iv. 13 April: Nature walk led by Tom and Peter

### j. DF (National Park City ranger, Lee Green Society)

- sighting of Great Spotted Woodpecker in Manor Park, will send pictures to EWD & JK
- ii. new hedge planted near Manor Park interesting selection of species, yew trees?
- iii. Heronry in Manor House Gardens, many Grey Herons spotted on the island

### k. DD (F/O River Pool)

- i. potential sighting of water vole in the Linear Park
- ii. Planted a lot of trees, including 5 black poplars (3 male, 2 female) from Caroline
- iii. Plans for a new pond in the Vineries area, discussion with Thames21

- London Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS): Public consultation likely from May 2025, adoption in autumn 2025
- ii. Northbrook Park wetlands project (Rewild London) is progressing well, only finishing touches and volunteer/education sessions remain

### b. JK updates:

- i. Nature's Gym and school sessions still ongoing in winter.
- ii. Jess and Emily to run taster sessions in Mountsfield Park in partnership with SLAM/Lewisham Adult Social Care for those who might be struggling with their mental health.
- iii. Green Flag Applications started.
- iv. Potential partnership with Capel Manor to get students sessions in Grove Park NR

#### c. EM updates (Glendale):

- i. 17 conservation sessions (Nature's Gym and Rivers & People)
  - Continuing the Mayow Park Wildlife area
  - Hare & Billet management
  - Orchard Maintenance Training with The Orchard Project
  - Coppicing & Deadhedges
- ii. Ongoing Bird Surveys
- iii. Mountsfield Park has a pond!
- iv. Will hope to be working with All Saints PS to spread seeds out on the bunds this spring.

#### d. JA updates (BPP):

- i. Bluebells appearing already
- ii. Since the start of Winter volunteers have been working in the woodland on our long-term management aims of reducing holly and bramble cover.

- iii. Thames21 have now completed the planned interventions in our stretch of the Ravensbourne, and the flood management work in the park is mostly complete.
- iv. This year the park will be trialling a new mowing regime in the parkland area and mowing round tree canopies for the regular cutting. This is linked to issues with Oak Processionary Moth
